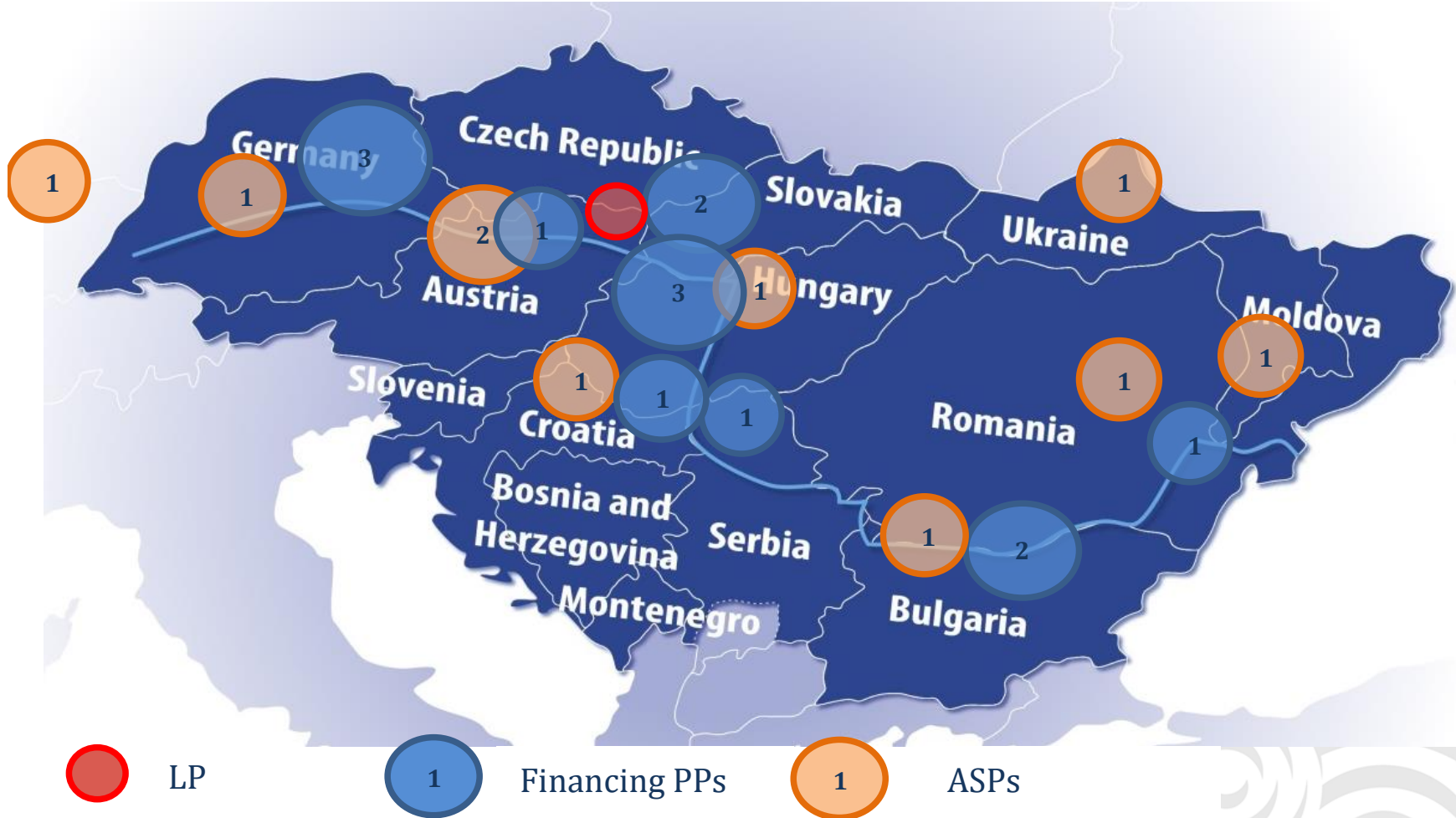
Danube Habitat Corridor

Mura-Drava-Danube Transboundary Biosphere Reserve corridor

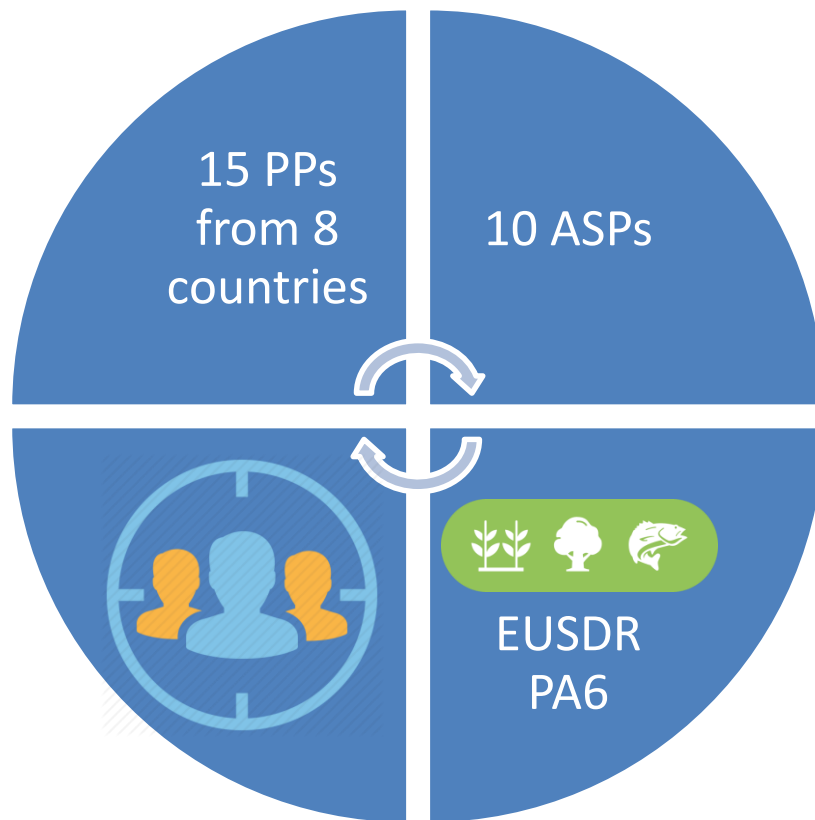

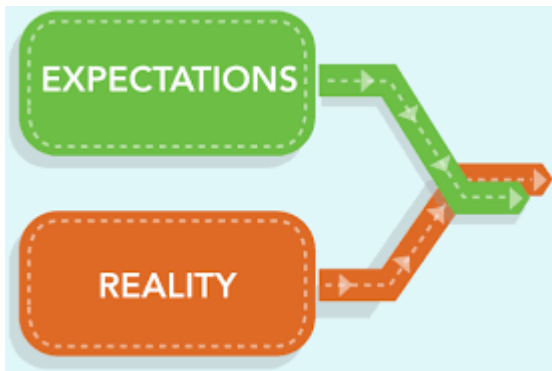

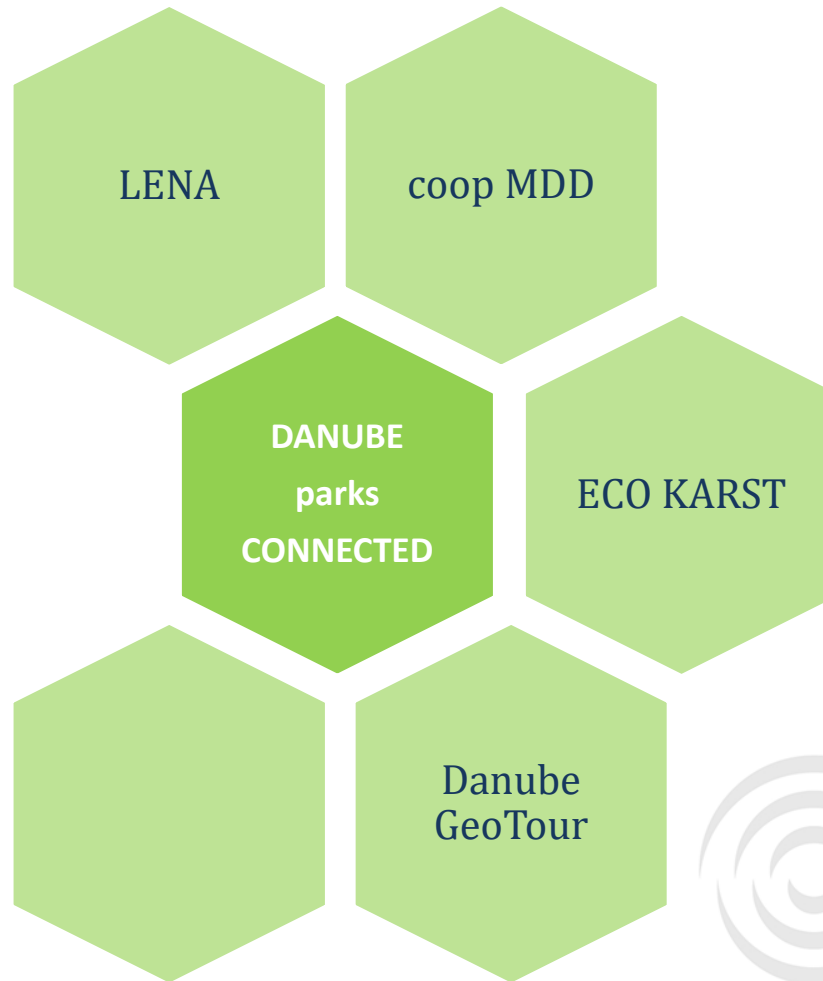
Valuable contribution to improve interlinking of habitats along the Danube river
