Port Governance Agency (PGA) IPA PP1



Port Governance Agency (PGA) is an agency established by the Government of the Republic of Serbia in 2013, and it is a Government regulatory body.

PGA has three important roles: regulatory, professional and the most important-development role

Our aim is to establish a regulated system, i.e. network of ports and harbours, which enables free and efficient movement of goods and passengers and safe traffic and transport.

All the efforts and objectives of the Agency are aimed at the development of ports and passenger terminals in Serbia and investments in port infrastructure.

In previous years PGA has achieved important results. Besides the declared port areas and passenger terminals, we recorded 9,3 million tons of reloaded goods in 2016., and introduced a new system for electronic registering users of port and harbor fees on the Portal of electronic applications.

Our future plans and goals are to develop 16 passenger terminals in the Republic of Serbia, out of which are 10 on the river Danube, 2 on the river Sava and 4 on the river Tisa, and to develop two new ports on the River Danube, in Belgrade and Apatin.

In 2016. we logged 958 port calls on passenger terminals and 119 000 passengers, which shows a steady growth trend.

In DAPhNE project PGA will participate in WP 5. Within activity 5.3, through the best practice research, development and deployment of Port Community System, PGA will be in charge of development and deployment of Statistics pilot module.
