

Travelling along the Danube sustainably





We love to travel! With its natural and cultural attractions, the Danube is one of the most promising tourist destinations in Europe!

But in many cases we are not travelling in a sustainable manner. Most visitors use their private car to reach the attractions along the Danube, entailing negative impacts on the environment and the local population. The previous project *Transdanube* has revealed that this is mainly due to a lack of mobility services and information.

To overcome these deficiencies, the partnership of Transdanube.Pearls follows a common vision:

... to develop socially fair, economically viable, environmentally friendly and health-promoting mobility services for visitors and inhabitants of the Dan-ube region. Within the project Transdanube.Pearls, 15 partners from 9 countries along the Danube will establish a network of outstanding destinations – the so-called Pearls – committed to sustainable mobility in tourism.

This network of destinations will offer visitors the possibility to travel

- to each Pearl
- from one Pearl to the other
- and within the Pearl

by using attractive sustainable means of transport e.g. train, bus, bike or ship, thus reducing the use of private cars.

Members of the network will benefit from

- increased visibility of each destination as part of a transnational network on the European and the worldwide tourist market
- joint marketing activities, attracting additional visitors
- knowledge transfer among regional and international stakeholders

In the next 2.5 years the partnership will

How to get there?

- establish a management organization marketing sustainable mobility in tourism on the transnational level
- improve sustainable mobility services, enabling visitors to reach the destinations (Pearls) and to travel without private car (mobility guarantee)
- provide user-friendly information on mobility services via tourism web portals as well as through mobility information centers in the regions
- train sustainable mobility managers acting as ambassadors for sustainable mobility in their regions
