

PRESENTING RESULTS – PARALLEL WORKSHOPS

How bachelor got professional?

Led by: Jaroslav Holeček (Automotive Industry Association of the Slovak Republic)

The session's first part explains how the implementation of professionally oriented higher education in the Slovak Republic had started, which alternatives we had had, and why we decided for professional Bachelor. We provide a summary of the most significant legislative changes for accrediting professionally oriented bachelor's degree programs, applicable not only in the Slovak conditions. The short introductory presentation is followed by an overview of the pilot project – Professional Bachelor in Automotive Industry, as an example of best practices and project output. Volkswagen Slovakia informs the audience about the success and challenges of the pilot project implementation, not only looking at the issue from the employer's perspective. In a lively discussion with a student participating in professionally oriented study programme, we find out what the students value the most about this study programme. The second part of the session is devoted to panel discussion, aiming to examine the implementation of professionally oriented study programmes from the perspective of employers, universities and policymakers. We evaluate the already achieved goals and point out future challenges.

Learning by Doing

In the 'Learning by doing' session we will discuss the issues of practice-oriented higher education. In particular, we pay special attention to the direct relationship between corporate partners and higher education institution through the example of dual education. The workshop will be a question-and-answer meeting starting with a keynote presentation, after which participants will discuss the issues and problems raised. The best practice from Hungary, which is so far the only one in the country, will also be shared.

Change your mindset + Take a new partnership role

Led by: Sebastijan Frumen and Robert Presker (University of Maribor)

The workshop will examine the course of action through which the University of Maribor has determined what Slovenia is lacking when it comes to cooperation between higher education institutions, economy, and external stakeholders. Based on the NDGM strategic document, we analysed the existing situation and, by minimally intervening in the teaching process, secured the pilot implementation of practical training within master's study programmes. The legislation does not require such training, however, employers expect graduates to be equipped with practical skills to make a smooth transition to the labour market. The project is a representation of implementing rapid and effective changes that reflect the labour market situation. We have been led by the motto "Change Your Mindset" (It can be done!).

Why capitalize?

We will discuss how capitalization activities can contribute to assuring the sustainability of project results.
