





Why do we need this WP?



- improve the capacity of measuring and inventorying HS pollution →8 national and 1 regional training courses held in 9 official languages of the DRB;
- extend the capacity for model application and scenario assessment → 3 transnational training courses held in English;
- enhance the capacity of quantifying, managing and mitigating HS pollution—technical guidance manual on HS pollution management to be presented at the final international workshop.





What do we do in WPT4 "Capacity building"?

1. Enhancement of the capacity in the Danube Basin for scoping, inventorying and monitoring of HS pollution

2. Enhancement of the capacity for HS emission modelling and scenario evaluation

3. Preparation of a concise technical guidance manual on hazardous substances pollution management

4. International workshop on management of HS pollution
