The main objective of **DanubePeerChains** is to empower Labour market Support Organizations (LSO) and Business Support Organizations (BSO) together with their target groups and further local high-potentials (entrepreneurs, SME employees, digitalization specialists) in a joint capacity building and training approach to upskill to high-qualified jobs in the Danube region and to gain sustainable recognition as PEER-level collaboration partners in innovative transnational value chains.

Capacity building activities to enhance competence of LSO + BSO

Developing and piloting the integrated DanubePeerChains capacity building approach and methodology will enhance the competence of business support and labour market support organizations in the project region for defining transformative activities and collaborative pilot projects reaching for cross-sectoral and transnational value chains.



Developing and piloting of multi-level trainings

Multi-level trainings will be developed and piloted for local entrepreneurs and SME employees from target industry sectors in key competence fields, namely advanced manufacturing technologies, human resource management and business model development based on the value chain perspective in the digital transformation context.

These activies will have a tremendous impact on the Danube countries, in particular on regional labour markets and the development of human resources and competencies of the entire population.
