

The interview of the manager of the LP of ISTER project National Museum of Transylvanian History in a local news program

Mr. Felix-Florin Marcu, the manager of the National Museum of Transylvanian History, talked on a local news program about the two very important discoveries made by the researchers from Cluj-Napoca while on the salvage excavation from the Transylvania motorway.

The first is the stretch of road between the villages of Nădășelu and Șardu, uncovered by the archaeologists from the National Museum of Transylvanian History.

The second discovery, made by the archaeologists from the Institute of Archeology and Art History, is a better-preserved stretch of road, found near the locality of Sutoru, where a roman fort also existed. Mr. Felix Marcu spoke about the importance of these two sections of the Eyton and Mera areas, which give important information about the imperial road leading from Drobeta to Porolissum.

Another topic approached One of the topics discussed was the possibility to preserve these finds as best as possible and the inclusion of the Dacian limes on the UNESCO heritage list, given that it is the longest and the most complex uninterrupted stretch of limes in Europe.

The last topic was the restoration of the medieval citadel of Bologna, where the National Museum of Transylvanian History has conducted research. It is expected the citadel to be open to the public this summer.
