Conference evaluation factsheet

Striving for Safer Infrastructure for all Road Users in the Danube Area

The final conference was an opportunity for the road safety organisations and experts to discuss and chart the future strategic directions focusing on the improvement of the road infrastructure safety in the Danube area for all road users.

The conference brought together 20 global road safety stakeholders to highlight RADAR project's results and demonstrate the benefits of systematic approach to safer road infrastructure. It has contributed to the debate of prioritisation of road safety investments and network wide road safety assessments under revised RISM directive and broader. In addition, the conference underlined the need to work towards the implementation of both the United Nations and European Commission goals on road safety.
