Adoption of First Pan-European Masterplan for Cycling Promotion

Paving the way for healthy and active mobility in the pan-European region

17. Adopt the Pan-European Master Plan for Cycling Promotion, as included in annex III to the present Declaration and developed by THE PEP Partnership on Cycling Promotion at the request of the Fourth High-level Meeting, as a means of achieving the objectives set out below in relation to cycling, and promote the implementation of its set of recommendations, in particular regarding the improvement of infrastructure and incentive frameworks to promote cycling;

First Pan-European Master Plan for Cycling Objectives









- > To **significantly increase cycling** in every country to contribute to the overall target of doubling cycling in the region as a whole;
- > To increase the overall transport system's resilience by providing space for cycling and walking;
- > To extend and improve the infrastructure for cycling and walking in every country in the region;
- To develop and implement national cycling policies, supported by national cycling plans, strategies and programmes including the setting of national targets in every country in the region;
- > To significantly increase cyclists' safety in every country in the region and in the region as a whole;
- > To integrate cycling into health policies
- > To integrate cycling and cycling infrastructure, into land use, urban, regional and transport planning.

Economic Benefits of Cycling in the Pan-European Region

- 750.000 jobs + 400.000 jobs when doubling cycling
- ➤ Up to 500 Billion €/year
- Doubling cycling would+prevent 30,000 deaths+reduce 8 million tons of CO2
- ➤ 14,5 Mio. bikes produced, 22 Mio sold 2020 in EU
- ➤ 2.2 billion cycle trips in EU, high benefits for local economy through cycling tourism

11 Fields of Action with 33 Recommendations
















- 1. Evaluate possibilities to integrate regulations to promote cycling and to increase cycling safety into national highway codes

- 3. Improve and harmonise vehicle (equipment) specifications


















Outlook on Implementation

- ➤ Design and establish a Pan-European Competence Centre for Active
- Facilitate the development of national cycling and walking plans, strategies and transnational cooperation projects like Danube Cycle Plans
- >Organize funding workshops with the International Financial Institutions
- ➤ Elaborate the Infrastructure Module (Trans European Cycle Route Network) for the Pan European Masterplan Cycling New UNECE Expert Group in liason with THE PEP Partnership

Cooperation for implementing the Pan-European Masterplan for Cycling Promotion National Level - Austrian Examples

- National cycling coordination and national agreement on cycling promotion between Federal Ministry and Federal States, Association of Cities and of Municipalities
- Financial & technical support programme klimaaktivmobil for cities, municipalities, regions focus on active mobility:

 15 times increase of federal funding up to 60 Mio Euro p.a. for active mobility infrastructure and mobility management
- Relaunch Austrian Masterplan Cycling 2030
- Reform of Austrian Traffic Code to improve situation for cyclists and pedestrians is on the way
- National campaign: Österreich radelt Austria is cycling


