ABOUT THE PROJECT

D-Care Labs project aimed at establishing specialised macro-regional D-Care Lab innovation structures to enable social service providers, product developers and social start-ups to design and implement better and innovative home care services and products for elderly persons, people with disabilities and children with special needs.

The story of the D-Care Labs goes all the way to 2020, when the partnership of 26 organisations from 10 countries started on their mission of creating innovative home care solutions. The partnership began working together and, in 2.5 years, successfully made an impact and a contribution to shaping a social Europe from the bottom up.

More than 230 participants from 9 countries joined our nine regional D-Care Labs and produced **57 new social innovations!**


We engaged more than 100 external experts, and identified more than 190 social investors





Total number of lab participants: 238*

*9 additional participants joined the new lab cycle occurring in Croatia.










ABOUT THE PROJECT - RESULTS

During the 2.5 years, we have worked on establishing and managed to establish a wide variety of regional partnerships - more than 60 in total.


The regional partners as a part of our networks are:

ABOUT THE PROJECT - RESULTS

The home care innovations produced in the scope of the project fall under 6 different types - the majority of solutions works on the prevention of care dependency (20 solutions).



We are also thrilled to present some of the success stories

In the case of **Croatia**, one innovation is funded by ESF+ and already operating on the market (visually-impaired entrepreneurs lead it). Another innovation is currently getting funds through a crowdfunding campaign.

In **Bulgaria**, FSSB signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the University of Ruse - the Bulgarian lab participants are and will be certified by the University of Ruse for social business modelling competencies. The team also secured the financial sustainability of the lab for the following year.

In Romania, the innovative service 'Social laundry' stemmed from the situation of home care beneficiaries in rural areas who do not have running water and cannot use a washing machine to sanitise clothing. For the purchase of the equipment, they obtained a grant of 29.000 EUR.

In the case of Germany, the social innovation lab already acquired 350,000 EUR for the regional lab and an additional 700,000 EUR for innovations.

D-CARE LABS HAPPENINGS PROJECT MEETING IN BULGARIA

Continuing the project activities, the D-CareLabs partnership went on the road again! This time the partnership joined forces in Sofia, Bulgaria, where the week of activities was dedicated to the reflection and discussion of the final outputs of the project.

The week's discussions also turned to future perspectives and the importance of the sustainability of the regional D-Care Labs. Colleagues (and our guests this week) from the Federation of social NGOs in Bulgaria - FSSB presented their inputs on the social impact networks and presented a live pitch on an app for care.





The first day of the project meeting began with a study visit of the foundation Concordia, a part of a network of organisations for public benefit in 8 countries. Concordia is working towards better social inclusion of young people and support of marginalised groups.

While at their headquarters, we visited the candle-making and pottery ateliers, where Concordia Bulgaria provides the first job experience for many youngsters.




The day continued at the Networking coworking Sofia, where we discussed growth, acceleration, peer-to-peer exchange, scaling, system innovation and more. We also held a workshop on the future of the project and the processes that will take place in the continuation of the work.

The day concluded with an excellent live pitch of a new app for caregivers and care beneficiaries called Grija, developed by Bulbera Ltd, with whom the FSSB signed a memorandum of understanding.

D-CARE LABS HAPPENINGS PROJECT MEETING IN BULGARIA

The second and last day of the D-Care Labs meeting in Bulgaria began with a session on the financial aspects of the project. It continued with a session that kick-started the team's brainstorming session - the discussion focused on the vision for the future of the Danube with partners teaming up to share their ideas and hopes for the future of the network & future collaboration for a more innovative Danube.



The day continued with discussions on the support system for the implementation of new home care services & products and more!









D-CARE LABS HAPPENINGS

STUDY VISIT IN SARAJEVO, BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

With the aim to continue the experience sharing, the D-Care Labs teams from Romania, Moldova, Hungary, Bulgaria and Croatia participated in a study visit to Mozaik, the Startup studio, and Centar za zdravo starenje Novo Sarajevo in the first week of December.

During the study visit, Mozaik presented its work in the field of social entrepreneurship in the Western Balkans, its work with youth and its innovative approaches to supporting of entrepreneurship and the development of business models.



In the second part, the team visited the "Centre for Healthy Aging", a project started 10 years ago that offers a day program to the elderly in the community with social activities, workshops, sports activities, trips and intergenerational activities.







The experience exchange continued in mid-December with a study visit to Budapest to our Hungarian partner Települési Önkormányzatok Országos Szövetsége - TÖOSZ.

D-CARE LABS HAPPENINGS

STUDY VISIT IN BUDAPEST, HUNGARY



Following the valuable study visit in Sarajevo, the D-Care Labs Hungarian partner TÖOSZ organized international professional days from 13 to 15 December, focusing on highlighting the experiences and results of the D-Care Labs project to the public. Taking part in the activities were also partners from Moldova, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Bulgaria.

The first day of the study visit began with a lecture by Dr Martin Ivanov (of the D-Care Labs team from FSSB), who gave a lecture on Bulgarian home care innovations at the TÖOSZ Municipal Innovation and Coordination Center.

The second day of the visit was dedicated to showcasing the TÖOSZ social innovation lab, D-Care Lab Budapest and its activities. Bulgarian, Bosnian, Croatian, Moldavian and Romanian project partners, as well as other interested stakeholders, were able to get a closer look at D-Care Lab Budapest. Deputy mayor Gergely Csiga greeted the participants on behalf of the XIII. district municipality and presented the district's community budget, while undersecretary Magdolna Karácsonyi presented the district's elderly and social innovations and good practices. General Secretary of TÖOSZ, Dr Ferenc Gyergyák, presented the results of the D-Care Lab Budapest. The participants were also addressed by Dr Veronika Andráczi-Tóth (Ministry of the Interior), who held a lecture on the present and future of care policy in Hungary.

The last day of the study visit was dedicated to field visits and presentations of good practices. Dr Ferenc Gyergyák presented TÖOSZ and its services, and Dr Bíróné Csilla Dienes, mayor of Szamossály, presented the good practice of the domestic elderly care facility and the Szamossály Municipality's institution for dementia patients. In the second part of the day, Dr Róbert Bolyán, director responsible for social investments at Unicredit Hungary, spoke about the financing options for social innovations, while Dr Anikó Soltész, D-Care Lab Budapest expert, spoke about the present and future of the lab.


