- Project offers specific support through an innovative blended learning programme and an easy-to-use and service-oriented Infodesk service

Project intervention logic

The project objective is to create an **environment** in which knowledge on ReSTI project management and administration in multicultural environment is becoming more readily available in the Danube Region through

- easy-to-use checklists
- learning modules
- advice with a specifically tailored content (Infodesk)

By addressing young administrators and managers, we increase the quality of all kinds of innovation projects implemented in the Danube Region. Know-how that is available at the partner institutions will be made available to our target group members, i.e. young graduates, early-stage PMs engaged in higher education, research, civil society institutions, NGOs and (small) businesses



Project specific objectives

- Increase competences in the implementation of research, social and technological innovation projects
- Increase employability of young graduates as project managers in these kinds of projects
- Develop strategies to improve research, social and technological innovation project participation



Innovative character

ReSTI activities, in particular learning modules build on existing offers, but distinguish themselves through

- tailored cross-sectoral focus
- specific offer to young graduates with a lack of skills in ReSTI management
- particular regional focus (DR)

Results achieved: background analysis

What we achieved so far?

WP3: Partners pulled together their resources and created a broad database of stakeholders

Network was used to <u>map the missing skills & competences concerning project management:</u>

- Desk research in 14 countries
- 51 best case practices on PM
- Danube Region-wide survey: 996 replies
- Around 200 interviews



Results achieved: online training courses

What we achieved so far?

WP4: Curriculum and online training courses

Based on the needs analysis and partners' expertise, 12 online learning courses (within 3 modules) were developed (until end of year it will be 20 courses within 5 modules)

Kick-off event: MILESTONE NOW

1–2 October, 2018 with the involvement of the 25 selected funded participants (WP5)



Target group: young graduates and early-stage project managers aiming for excellence in research, technological and social innovation project management

Content: five modules addressing (1) EU policies, (2) project design, (3) project management, (4) social innovation and (5) business innovation,

Blended learning:

- 3 face-to-face meetings
- 20 online courses

Time frame

- Work can be completed within 2 semesters
- Pilot: 10/2018 06/2019



What we achieved so far?


WP6: improve the general knowledge on project management
