1. INFORMATION ARCHITECTURE AND UX DESIGN

The Danube Compass information platform has been designed to emphasise information for economic migrants and the institutisons they will probably be dealing with. To emphasize information as clearly as possible all the entries have been organized to categories and subcategories which reach 3-4 levels depending on the top-level category. All the categorization has roots in 6 main categories which were identified as the most comprehensive so they can be easily grasped by the users. Although categorization of entries has been carefully edited, we also developed other features to help navigate the information platforms such as related institutions and related content shown as a part of each entry content. The most important navigational tool apart from the category navigation is the site search, which indexes the title and the content area of each entry.



2. THE VISUAL DESIGN

The visual design aims to put pure information in the front seat following the usability guidelines such as GDS's from the gov.uk website. The approach therefore is focused on information hiearchy, maximizing legibility even user's ability of comprehension of the presented language is limited. This is achieved through a clean typeface with large open counters and its comfortable size to read. Also the contrast of the text against the background plays an important role in legibility. Apart from the rather rigid typographic scheme - completely dedicated to legibility - the bold, lively colour scheme and the home page illustrations of the country's most notable sights give the site friendly look to encourage users to approach the platform content with a positive attitude towards getting information and learning about the country they currently are staying in.Examples of the visual design:



3. THE TECHNICAL SOLUTION

The whole platform is build on WordPress CMS (with a custom field and multilanguage plug-ins) using custom designed theme, build solely for this puprose. Each country site is its own WordPress installation. The reasons to choose WordPress over custom built CMS or other solutions were:

- Many of the country editors already now how to use WordPress as it is one of the world's most used CMS. This enables faster input with less skilled persons doing the input.
- As it is an open source solution, it allows scalability and independence from the initial vendor adding to the tool's sustainability.
- It is flexible enough to add new features in the future if the need arises, adding to the tool transferability and sustainability (e.g. joining other territories, adding topics).
