The maps show the so called **Connectivity Functionality Index**, which is derived by combining analysis on the connectivity of protected areas and the provision of Ecosystem Services. A high value indicates a very high potential of an area to serve as a multifunctional corridor between protected areas.

The designated “**Areas of Interest**” indicate recommendations on where actions towards a higher ecological connectivity of the European Green Belt in the Danube Region should be focussed.
