1 Chapter: Description of the Deliverable T2.3.3

The Interreg Danube Transnational Programme project Transdanube Travel Stories (TDTS) aims to promote sustainable tourism in the Danube Region with new narratives.

In the progress of the project, various measures and activities are implemented to promote sustainable means of transport.

While other deliverables, such as the creation of the Sustainable Tourism Mobility Plans (STOMPs), aim at identifying different opportunities for sustainable travel, the deliverables in WP 2 in the last phase of the project focus on the communication of this information.

In order to inform the target group of tourists in the best possible way about sustainable travel options and to motivate them to use this sustainable mobility services, the deliverable T2.2.3 aims at updating Touristic Information Material as websites, brochures and trip planners to include (more) information on sustainable mobility services to get to the promoted destinations and points of interests.

2 Chapter: Concept for the Implementation of the Deliverable T2.3.3

The concept for the implementation of the deliverable D. T2.3.3 is divided in three parts. A questionnaire to survey the current status of information on sustainable mobility in the respective organisations of the project partners (1), an individual online meeting with "good practice" examples and further planning (2) and the implementation of the updating and development of the tourism information material on sustainable travel opportunities, as well as the documentation of the same (3).

The first part consists of a questionnaire, which contains questions about the current promotion on sustainable mobility services of the organisation of the individual partners. The questionnaire is asking about strategies, promotion material and different channels of promotion, such as print information material, websites or social media like Instagram and Facebook. The questionnaire also asks about events like conferences and concerning to that about the advertisement for sustainable mobility to reach the events. Finally, the questionnaire also contains questions on the budget for the deliverable and the planned updates. The online questionnaire has been sent to each PP by the WP2 lead DO.

As a next step individual online meetings with each project partner are organized. DO prepared a presentation on the deliverable, further steps and researched and selected good practice examples (see annex) for the different kinds of information material which were also presented to the partners. Afterwards the next steps and the individual plans of each project partner on the deliverable were discussed and collected.

Summary of possibilities to integrate sustainable mobility

- · Link to further information on the homepage of the website
- Links to mobility providers, e.g. local public transport and rail companies
- Information visible at first glance, supported by symbols, colors, photos, videos etc.
- Information on e.g. bicycle rental
- Integrate maps and (the developed) "Travel Time Maps"
- Information on "last mile"
- QR codes are e.g. suitable for printed information material and social media (they require little space and can lead directly to the homepage of mobility providers, so that e.g. the leaflet can be used sustainable for a long time)



The project-partners provided DO with screenshots and data of the present information material. As the lead of the WP 2 DO is working on the documentation of the deliverable to provide a before and after comparison of the updated touristic information material concerning information on sustainable mobility services and offers. The project partners are working on the update of the information material and are informing the DO about changes for the on-going documentation.

In the following chapter, there is a separate sub-chapter for each project partner. Differentiated according to different tourism information materials and/or communication channels, the respective status at the individual meetings at the beginning of 2022 regarding information on sustainable mobility is documented. Subsequently, screenshots of the updated information material are presented in order to show a before and after comparison and thus the implementation of deliverable T2.3.3.



3 Chapter: Documentation of each project partner

3.1: WGD Danube Upper Austria Tourism Ltd


3.1.1 Websites/ Homepage

The Danube Upper Austria Ltd has two different websites. The <u>Danube pearls</u>, which presents the results of the Interreg projects Transdanube Pearls and Transdanube Travel Stories and the "<u>donauregion</u>" website.

On the Danube Pearls website in the top lane, you can see the category "mobility" with the subcategories "getting there" and "pearl hopping", which prepares information on traveling between the Danube pearls. In the first widget, there is a description on how to get there by bike or by e-bike. Followed by information to travel by bus or by train. That is excellent because you do not give the visitor any advice on how to get there by car or plane, so the visitor is encouraged to go there in a sustainable way. Also very helpful is the railway widget where you can easily look up when your bus or train is leaving. On the second website, it is similar to the first site when it comes to how to get there. First it is recommended to get there by bus and train, then by bike and then by car. In addition, that is another way to promote sustainable mobility. On every subcategory, there is a link to the oebb (Austrian Train Company) where you can easily book a ticket. There is also an extra sub-page for the Danube Cycle Path, which includes an interactive map and cycle tours, as well as information on cycle hire stations and charging facilities for e-bikes.




1 Getting to the Upper Danube Region - before Screenshot




The project partners are also responsible for the content and maintenance of the Danube Austria website. On the sub-page on how to get there, travel by car was originally described first and thus the focus.













3.1.2 Website updates

On the "donauregion" website our project partners from the Danube Upper Austria Ltd updated the information on the subpage "Location and getting there" (illustration number 6). As a new feature the developed Travel Time Map for Linz and a direct link to the Danube pearls website with further information on sustainable travel options along the Danube are integrated. Furthermore, a new map for cyclists and hikers has been created, showing information on Danube ferries, navigation offers and bridges for crossing the river. A detailed map of the Danube Cycle Path with lots of useful information, such as topographical information on sections of the cycle path, has also been updated and integrated on the website.








10 Updated Danube Pearls website, now includes a new subpage with all of the eight developed travel Time Maps



For the <u>Danube Austria website</u>, the project partners also used the collected good practice examples as motivation and showed that you can make a difference even with few resources. The listing of the different mobility options was revised. As a result, local transport is now at the top and with the integrated tool for searching for rail connections, it is now absolutely in focus. This way, tourists are first made aware of sustainable mobility options before they think about travelling by car.



3.1.4 Brochures

In the accommodation register, all information can be found in German and English. In addition to an overview of accommodations, this also includes a general map of the Danube Cycle Path in Upper Austria with motivating and beautifully presented experiences by bike or on foot along the Danube. The Danube Card is also presented, with which you can also get discounts on bicycle rentals, among other things. As this is a detailed and up-to-date information material with a focus on sustainable tourism and sustainable mobility, no update is planned.

3.2 Tourism Board Linz

3.2.1 Website/Homepage

On the Linztourism website, there are subcategories called "getting to Linz", the first thing you will see is getting there by train, and the second thing you will see is getting there by car. Another subcategory is called "transfer in Linz". Here you can see the local transport connections that are primarily sustainable (beside taxi) and this is again an easy way to promote sustainable mobility. As can be seen in the following illustrations, the project partners from the Tourism Board Linz have already integrated a lot of information on sustainable mobility offers on their website. With many links and information on public transport and travelling by train, tourists are motivated to travel to Linz in a sustainable way and to move around the city in a sustainable way.

Today, Linz is quick and easy to reach by water, land and air thanks to a good network of autobahns and the Linz Airport. A short, safe trip







3.2.2 Website updates


On the subpages <u>"Taking the train to Linz"</u> and <u>"Travel to Linz bey bus"</u> the Travel Time Map for Linz has been integrated. This shows a selection of motivating train and bus connections to Linz and thus visualises the good connections to long-distance traffic. Tourists are thus informed that they do not need their own car for a trip to Linz and a holiday in the city and that they can travel sustainably without any difficulties.

Another update on the website is the promotion of the new so-called "space ticket". In addition to a new marketing strategy for the city of Linz, the project partners have implemented another measure to promote sustainable mobility. If you travel to Linz by train from a distance of at least 20 kilometres, you can now redeem your train ticket at the tourist information office for a €10.00 voucher, which can be used in 1000 different ways.



21 Promotion of the new voucher for sustainable travel by train




3.2.3 Linz Card

There is a special offer you can use in Linz: <u>The Linz Card</u>. This linz card is available for one, two or three days. In addition to discounts in cultural and gastronomic establishments, the price also includes the use of public transport in the Linz city area. From a validity of two days, the ride on the Pöstlingsbergbahn, a popular and sustainable excursion, is also free of charge.

3.2.4 Linz App

The <u>Linz app</u> is just like the homepage. It gives a detailed description of how to get there in a sustainable way. It also gives an overview about how to travel in Linz for example you can rent a bicycle via the App.








22 examples of Linz App


23 Map of public transport in Linz

24 contact information and interactive map on West Pannon website



3.3.2 Website updates

The project partners of West Pannon have linked another newly created subpage on the "Contact" subpage. Under "Mobility information" you can now find a lot of information on sustainable mobility. The newly created Travel Time Map for Budapest was integrated and the interactive maps were added, so that there is a map for both locations, which can, for example, show the walking distance from the public transport to the organisation's locations. In addition, information and links for public transport and train connections were added. These are shown as linked websites but also as QR codes. Brochures and social media are not currently used for public communication.

3.4 Institute for Culture, Tourism and Sport Murska Sobota

3.4.1 Websites/Homepage

Our project partners from Murska Sobota in Slovenia are also responsible for two different websites. On the one hand, the website of the organisation <u>Institute for Culture, Tourism and Sport Murska Sobota</u> in Slovenian. And on the other hand the general website <u>www.visitmurskasobota.si</u> for tourism in Murska Sobota. On the website of the organisation there was no information on sustainable mobility so far. On the website visit Murska Sobota there was a paragraph under the heading "Murska Sobota for a green future" which summarised the information on sustainable, regional mobility offers in general.

GREEN MOBILITY

The Municipality of Murska Sobota is a destination of short and safe routes that are accessible to all. The destination offers residents and visitors a network of quality bicycle connections, which are constantly expanding into settlements, excellent walking conditions, attractive public suburban passenger transport and urban passenger transport Sobočanec, Avant2Go vehicle sharing system, Prostofer call transport and Soboški biciklin bicycle sharing system. Soboški biciklin have additional stations outside the city in recent years. In 2021, the RESPONSIBUS activity was launched, which enables free transport of visitors of the surrounding spas to events in Murska Sobota. Mobility planning is subordinated to the realization of the vision of creating better sustainable transport areas, especially for pedestrians, cyclists and the physically and sensory impaired, and at the same time creating a better living environment. We are proud to have disabled access to all public buildings and tourist attractions.

GREEN THOUGHT

The destination will continue to promote the sustainable development of tourism. In addition to the already established activities, also by preparing strategic documents such as the Strategy for Sustainable Tourism Development in MOMS 2022-2027, monitoring indicators, promoting sustainability not only to the population but also to the private sector, etc.

A green destination is environmentally and socially responsible, which can only be achieved together – all stakeholders in the destination, in the public, non-governmental and private sectors – not only in tourism, but in all areas of activity.




28 Information on sustainable mobility on the website of visit Murska Sobota



3.4.3 Brochures












38 overview of Croatian destinations on the six trails






39 new subpage with information on sustainable mobility for Ilok



3.6 Association for promoting tourism in Oradea and its region

3.6.1 Website/Homepage

The project partners from Oradea, Romania are responsible for the website https://www.visitoradea.com/. On the subpage "How to get to Oradea" you can find general information on travel options by car, train and plane. In this case, it is recommended to first describe the travel options by train, as well as to add bus connections and the new developed Travel Time Map for Oradea, in order to bring sustainable mobility into focus and to motivate tourists even more to travel sustainable.

Oradea is an important node of regional and European transport, being located at the convergence of the two trans-European networks that cross Romania on the east-west direction, respectively the European road E60 (Cluj-Napoca, Brașov, Sibiu, Bucharest) and the north-south axis, to which #Oradea is connected to by DN76 (Maramureș, Timișoara, Deva, Danube). From Oradea, you can reach Budapest in 3 hours and Vienna in 5 hours, which means that, on a weekend, you can have a relaxing Art Nouveau themed #citybreak.



Oradea is a railway node for links with European countries, through the border crossing Episcopia Bihor. The city is easily accessible, with direct railway links to the most important cities of Romania (Constanța, Brașov, Bucharest, Timișoara, etc.), but also to important European ones. Passengers from the country or coming from/going to Central and Western Europe transit the Central Station and the peripheral stations. "Transilvania" train runs daily on the route Vienna-Oradea-Cluj-Napoca, and tickets can be purchased here: https://tickets.oebb.at/en/ticket.



For a quick trip, choose the flights proposed by Oradea International Airport. Located only 6 km away from the city, it currently operates the following flights:

Furthermore, there is a subpage on the topic <u>"Oradea on foot"</u>, on which five thematic routes/ walks through the city are described. There are walks on the topics: Oradea, Architectural Treasures, Oradea, Art and Culture (1 and 2), Oradea, Multicultural City and Oradea, through the eyes of a child. For each tour there is another subpage with information on the sights along the route and details such as the distance, time and consumed calories.



This is a good way to promote sustainable mobility and inform and motivate tourists to explore the destination on foot.


3.6.2 Website updates

The project partners of Visit Oradea in Romania use a lot of digital information material, mainly their informative and elaborate website for public relations.

On the subpage "Projects", a number of information on promoting the use of (regional) sustainable mobility has been updated. There are now four more image tiles, each of which links to another sub-page with further information.

There is now a sub-page with an interactive map of different cycling tours in Oradea and further information on cycling in Oradea. Following this, there is now also a sub-page with information about the 250 E-scooters in the city and the general conditions for their use. The third tile leads to a subpage that informs tourists about public transport in Oradea and plans to expand the network. Last but not least, there is a subpage on which the newly created Travel Time Map for Oradea is integrated to show tourists sustainable and motivating train and bus connections for travelling to Oradea.

These comprehensive updates now provide tourists with a wide range of information on sustainable mobility, promoting sustainable travel to and mobility within the city.

The residents of Oradea now have 250 electric scooters at their disposal for getting around the city as of this week. Users must bear in mind that these vehicles must be left near cycle tracks and not in areas when using them. The traffic committee of Oradea City Hall gave Bott Operation Ou authorization for 25 areas designated for electric scooters. The notice is in effect through the end of May, and an extension request has also been made. The scooters do not require any new infrastructure or additional development because they are dockless. In accordance with the Oradea Municipality's rules for using electric scooters on the public domain, riders must be at least 14 years old and ride in the first lane of the road, unless there are designated bike lanes nearby, in which case they must use those. In addition, anyone under the age of 16 must wear a helmet. You can ride your scooter on sidewalks only if a bicycle lane is marked, or on trails in parks if they do not cause distress for people. Electric scooters can ride at a maximum speed of 25 km/h in Oradea, or 10 km/h in Unirii and Ferdinand squares, as well as the area around the St. Ladislaus bridge. Scooters are not allowed to stop or be parked on the road, in public transportation stations, taxi stops, car parking spaces, pedestrian crossings, bicycle lanes, green areas, or in vehicle access zones, according to the regulations.

Oradea's city administration is modernizing its public transportation system by purchasing new trams and electric charging stations. The National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR) will fund the procurement of seven trams and 45 electric charging stations

The purchase will be made following the Ministry of Development, Public Works and Administration's approval of the project "Modernization of the tram fleet in Oradea Municipality - stage 1," which was submitted for financing through the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), Component C10 - Local Fund, Operation 11.1 - Renewal of the vehicle fleet intended for public transportation.


The PNRR will fund the acquisition of the seven trams as well as the installation of 45 charging stations for electric vehicles. According to the feasibility study, the unit value of a tram is 8,785,612.99 lei (without VAT), or 1,784,714.28 euros (without VAT), whereas the unit value of an electric vehicle charging station is 123,067.50 lei (without VAT), or 25,000 remout vari, whereas the air value of an elective varieties and sing station is 12,007.30 et (window var), or 22,000 euros (without VAT). The project has a total cost of 79,774,420.80 lei (with VAT) or 16,205,419.95 euros (value with VAT included). The PNRR financing rate is 100 percent.

The project was submitted for funding by Oradea City Hall's Management Directorate for Projects with International

Truiting.

The city of Oradea continues to invest in projects in the field of public transportation in an effort to improve the appeal of these modes of transportation through the purchase of new trams and buses as well as through other ancillary actions that improve passenger comfort. A new tram route between Calea Aradului - Ceyat - Cantemir was completed and the municipality of Oradea purchased 20 new trams and 22 new buses in the past two years.









3.7.6 Events

The three Danube Parks in Croatia organized the TIKFest – Living history and gastronomy festival on the 7th May 2022 on the newly restored Tikves Castle grounds. This venue, as well as many of the Danube parks, are very difficult to reach by public transport, so most visitors arrive by their own cars. To create a sustainable alternative for this, a bus shuttle was organized for the first time and it was communicated that it is not possible to arrive by private cars. This was unusual for most of the visitors, but was all in all positively received and the festival was a great success – also for the promotion of sustainable mobility.





3.8.2 Brochures and newspaper articles

Every two years, the Danube Office Ulm/Neu-Ulm organises the International Danube Festival. For ten days, there is a hustle and bustle on both sides of the Danube bank when international artists and guests from all countries along the Danube come together at the festival of encounters. The International Danube Festival is a showcase for the international Danube partnership and cultural encounter. The focus is on unity in diversity, the idea of cultural cooperation in Europe and strengthening cohesion in the Danube region.

At the 12th International Danube Festival 2022 there were around 200 individual events, which were enjoyed by more than 400,000 visitors. Therefore, it is important to show sustainable travel options in the public relations work and promotion of the festival.

In the detailed programme for the Danube Festival 2022, there is a double page on the topic of access and sustainable mobility. Here tourists find a map and relevant information on how to get there by public transport, on foot and by bike, by coach, and again only in the last place information on how to get there by car. In addition, the local newspaper publishes a special edition on the Danube Festival, which also deals with the topic of travel options. Here, too, information is first given on how to get there by bicycle and public transport. Additionally, train and relevant bus stops are marked on the city map below. To further motivate visitors to travel sustainably, QR codes have also been added for the International Danube Festival 2022. These lead directly to the public transport websites, for example, to inform oneself about tickets and purchase them. As these media are published locally, they are currently only available in German. For the next festival in 2024, it is planned to create this information also in English for international visitors.



4 Conclusion and recommendations

The impact of our current mobility on the development of the climate is now generally an undisputed consensus. In addition to mobility in everyday life, the mobility and the chosen modes of transport of tourists are decisive here. Promoting opportunities for sustainable mobility is therefore of great importance on the one hand from the perspective of climate and nature protection, and on the other hand also because of the growing awareness and demand on the part of tourists themselves.

The issue of sustainable mobility itself is a very big topic and issues concerning infrastructure, for example, must of course also be implemented politically.

Nevertheless, every organisation, especially in the tourism sector, can make a decisive contribution.

Depending on the available resources, the use of sustainable mobility offers can be promoted by e.g. providing links and useful information to tourists, by collecting regional offers, by providing incentives for sustainable travel or by organising offers such as bicycle rental or a shuttle bus for the last mile.

The TDTS project has once again shown that there are still relatively large differences between the countries in the Danube Region in this area, for example with regard to the expansion of the rail network.

However, it also became clear that the topic of sustainable mobility is gaining in importance everywhere.

In addition, detailed research and networking showed that there are already more activities and offers for sustainable mobility services than tourists and often also locals are aware of. Last but not least it is most important for each organisation to get started with considering and working on the topic of sustainable mobility as part of the daily work and not just in case resources and spare time occurs.



The Mauthausen concentration camp, together with the Gusen concentration camp and over 40 satellite camps, was the central site of political, social and racial persecution by the National Socialist regime on Austrian soil from 1938 - 1945.

Today, the Mauthausen concentration camp memorial is an international place of remembrance and historical-political education. In addition to the preserved historical buildings and facilities, the Wiener Graben quarry with the "Death Staircase" and the international memorial park, two permanent exhibitions and the memorial room "Room of Names" can be visited. The permanent exhibition in the former infirmary offers a true-to-source and scientifically based presentation of the National Socialist concentration camp system, as well as the Mauthausen concentration camp and its subcamps.

On 19 August 1989, the Pan-European Union organized a peace demonstration, the Pan-European Picnic, at the border north of Sopron together with the Hungarian Democratic Forum. During this event, under the patronage of the emperor's son Otto von Habsburg - the latter under the protective hand of the Hungarian Chief Reformist and Minister of State Imre Pozsgay - a gate in the border fence was to be symbolically opened for one hour. In the days that followed, the border guards were tightened, but three weeks later, on 11 September, they were opened to GDR citizens without restriction. In addition to a signposted border trail with a watchtower, a number of artworks in various forms of expression commemorate the event, including a fountain house, the freedom bell and the monument of the open doors.

After the Turkish battles, the fortification system lost its main function and was therefore neglected



The Golubac Fortress was a medieval fortified town on the south side of the Danube River, 4 km (2.5 mi) downstream from the modern-day town of Golubac, Serbia. According to recent discoveries, the fortress, which was built during the 14th century by Medieval Serbian state, is split into three compounds which were built in stages. It has ten towers, most of which started square, and several of which received many-sided reinforcements with the advent of firearms.

Unwind on the hotel's Danube terrace and transport yourself back 1800 years, when Roman soldiers monitored the river from here. While the little ones try their hand at being Romans at the Roman playground in the leisure centre right next to the bathing building, the adults can find out about Roman bathing culture and linger on relaxation loungers before continuing their hike.

Guided Tour to the Roman sites in the inner city from Sopron

Sopron in hiding: the ancient city of Scarbantia

A visit to the underground exhibition spaces of Sopron, where the city founded in the 1st century AD is revealed. Our walk starts in the Forum Museum, the main square of the Roman city, and continues on the Monastery Street, in the Iseum. The Egyptian mother goddess Isis, a symbol of femininity and fidelity, came to Sopron with the conquests. The walk then takes us to the Tower of Fire, where we will see the Roman walls, and then to the stone vault of the Fabricius House, where we will learn about the Roman beliefs, meet the arch-gods Jupiter, Juno and Minerva, and learn the story of the sun god Mithras.

Medieval inner-city – Fő tér

From the Fidelity Fountain, passing through the Front Gate, you enter the Main Square, whose layout and the location of its buildings have remained unchanged since the 13th century. The names of the Main Square reflect the passage of time and its role in the life of the town. All the buildings in the square are monuments, with the Holy Trinity statue in the centre.

Fabricius-house

The Fabricius House is built on the remains of a Roman public building. In 1320, construction of the chapel of St Dorothy began on this site. Later a slab was added to divide the building in two. The lower part became a cellar and the upper part a dwelling. The present form of the building dates from the 17th century. The two-storey loggia of the courtyard and the carved ceiling of the first floor of the street wing date from this period. The Archaeological Exhibition of the Soproni Museum is located in the Fabricius House. 1 st century (A.D.) amber rings from Scarbantia

Forum Museum- Ruin garden - Scarbantia archaeological park - Exhibition

Four and a half meters below the centre of Sopron lay the ruins of the Roman town Scarbantia. On the basement level of the Iron House on the corner of Új Street-Szent György Street, under the Tourinform office, visitors can see the southern part of the Scarbantia forum in the FORUM SCARBANTIAE exhibition opened in 1994. Based on the forum representation found in Pompeii we can assume that traders were selling their articles during the day at the Scarbantia forum, and from the evening hours and on festive occasions, local citizens were conversing here. Here they could get information from merchants arriving from distant lands or from officials managing the affairs of the Province of the Empire who arrived on the high-traffic long-distance road from Carnuntum (Deutsch-Altenburg, Petronell), Vindobona (Vienna), or Savaria (Szombathely). In Scarbantia, especially around the Forum, travellers could find all the services that were common in major Roman cities. Sanctuaries, baths, comfortable accommodation, shops, workshops and last but not least, wine bars were open for the guests. The game table on display on the Forum could have stood in such an inn.

Fire Tower:

The Fire Tower is a symbol of the town of Sopron. It has Roman foundations, its cylindrical part is medieval, its balcony and clock tower are Renaissance, its dome is Baroque. Its Loyalty Gate frames the 2,000-year history of the town centre. The baroque onion dome of the Fire Tower rises to a height of 58 meters with the two-headed eagle, so it can be seen from several parts of the town. After climbing its nearly 200 spiral stairs, its round balcony offers an unparalleled view of the town centre and the Lövérek surrounding Sopron, and in clear weather, you can even see the nearby mountains of the Alps (Rax, Schneeberg).

St Martin's Cemetery and the Early Christian monuments of Savaria

It is the oldest and longest-used public cemetery in the country, and probably in Central and
Eastern Europe, on the road leading east from Szombathely. According to the archaeological
evidence, the cemetery next to the present-day Church of St. Martin was the burial place of the
Romans who lived here from the 1st century AD. In the 4th century, a continuous Christian burial
ground was established in the cemetery area, the centre of which was probably the tomb of St
Quirinus, Bishop of Siscia (Sisak, Serbia), who was martyred in the city. This is the site of the richest
collection of Early Christian tombs in Hungary, preserved partly by the Savaria Museum and partly
by the Hungarian National Museum. The cemetery's use over the centuries was influenced by the
fact that the Roman building that stood here was later identified with the birthplace of Bishop
Saint Martin.

One of the country's largest and longest-running rural museums was established in 1908, but its predecessor was the Vas County Archaeological Society, which was founded in 1872 and previously exhibited its artefacts in the Sala Terrena of the Bishop's Palace. The collection of Roman artefacts in Savaria, however, goes back much further, since at the end of the 15th century Pietro Ransano, the court historian of King Matthias, already mentioned the Roman monuments collected in Szombathely. The museum is housed in a historicist building designed by Győző Czigler. The institution has an extremely rich Roman collection, with many rarities. Among these, the gold treasure found at Katafa, the jewellery from Balozsameggyes, and bronze and marble sculptures are the most interesting. In addition to the permanent exhibition on display in the museum's upstairs exhibition hall, the most valuable items from the collection have been presented by experts during travelling exhibitions abroad (Cremona, Heidelberg, Aalen, Konstanz, Brno, Lyon, Vienna and Graz). The Lapidarium of the Savaria Museum offers the richest display of Roman stone carvings after the Aquincum collection. In addition to the tombs of the soldiers who founded the city, there is a fragment of an early imperial victory monument, huge statues of Jupiter, Juno and Minerva,





the archetypal gods of the Roman Pantheon, a special **Transdanube Travel Stories** milestone and unique altars dedicated to the deities of the Way.

Iseum Roman Isis Sanctuary and Museum

The Iseum is Szombathely's most famous ancient monument, and deservedly world-famous. The huge sanctuary complex is the third largest Roman temple of Isis known in the world today - larger only than the main temples of Alexandria and Rome City, and the largest in the world. But recent research has changed the picture of the sanctuary considerably. And the huge quantity of finds that have been recovered has clarified the chronology of the sanctuary's use and provided important data on everyday life in the sanctuary and its surroundings. In the period before the church was built, Savaria had an important industrial district on the site of the Iseum. Apart from weaving and pottery, bronze casting workshops were the most important. In the first third of the 2nd century AD, the industrial facilities were demolished and replaced by the 42x70 m sanctuary of the Egyptian goddess Isis. From the huge transverse entrance hall, you could walk between the monumental granite columns that still stand today, to the paved courtyard crossed by a collonaded hall, where the sanctuary of the goddess Isis stood on a high platform. The six-columned main façade was decorated with elaborately carved white marble beams and cornices, full-length images of Isis 'riding' a dog, and Serapis, Mars and Victoria.

Járdányi Paulovics István Roman Ruin Garden

The Roman Ruin Garden, named after its first explorer István Járdányi-Paulovics, presents the largest contiguous section of Savaria's remains. The former Bishop's Garden, located next to the Cathedral, owes its existence to a fortunate coincidence. The construction work was halted and excavation and restoration work began. Excavations in the Ruin Garden revealed a series of residential buildings and several important public buildings. The impressive details of the Roman streets paved with basalt stones, the ruins of a small shrine to Mercurius, patron god of trade and travel, an extended section of the city wall and the workshops of the pottery quarter outside the wall were excavated and displayed. But the best known and most impressive feature of the ruined garden is the aforementioned 4th-century mosaic floor, which, even in its fragmentary state, is the largest continuous mosaic floor in Pannonia.

Sala Terrena

The Romanesque exhibition on the ground floor of the Bishop's Palace, next to the Ruin Garden, promises to be a unique attraction. Once the first archaeological museum in Hungary, this magnificent room in the palace of Bishop János Szily is decorated with splendid paintings by István Dorffmeister dating from 1784. Most of them were modelled on Roman pieces found in the soil of Savaria and engravings by the 18th-century Piranesi.

Architectural highlights of Oradea

The <u>Stem</u> building sends us back in the early years of the 20th century, its story begins in the moment when the chemist and engineer Stern Miklós bought a land from the Local Council, right on the central part of the city.

The **Moskovits Palace** is composed from a basement, a high ground floor, a mezzanine and two floors. The basement was intended for storage areas, the first floor for shops and store rooms.

The <u>Art Noveau Museum</u> is hosted by the Darvas-La Roche House in Oradea, a symbolic building of this northwestern Romania city. It is the first Art Nouveau Museum in the country.

The architect Kálmán Rimanóczy junior is representative of the eclecticism of Oradea. He built between 1912 and 1914, the <u>Apollo Palace</u> on the main commercial artery of the city.

The <u>Black Fagle Palace</u> is an architectural monument representative for Oradea, located in the main (pedestrian center).

The <u>Poynár House</u> is a representative building with multy-storey, built at the beginning of the 20th century in the place of an old house owned by the Poynár family (Pojnar).

The <u>Ullmann Palace</u> was built in 1913 in Jugendstil. after the plans of Lobl Ferencz. Its windows are decorated by stained glass.

Get to know the Jewish history of Oradea:

Jewish History Tour: Oradea has 6 synagogues: Sion Neolog Synagogue, Ortodox Synagogue, Aachvas rein Synagogue etc. The first Jewish names in Oradea are linked to documents dating from the last years of the 15 century. As Jews were not allowed to spend the nights in the city almost until the enf of 18 century, the Jewish community would become stronger only during the first decades of the 19 century. By the beginning off the 20 century almost one third of Oradea population was Jewish. They played a crucial role in the city life and development.

Architectural highlights of Szeged

The <u>Széchenyi tér</u> was built in the 13th century, on the banks of the Tisza River.

The <u>Klauzál tér</u>. At the Dugonics tér end of <u>Kárász utca</u> there is situated the statue group of "Street Music". In the middle of the Mediterranian-inspired Klauzál tér stands the first full-size full-figure statue of Lajos Kossuth.

The <u>Dóm Square</u> combines the characteristics of a Mediterranean style piazza, with the formal brick architecture. The square is the symbolic centre of a new beginning.

The <u>Votive Church</u> and Cathedral of Our Lady of Hungary is a twin-spired church. It lies on Dóm square, beside the Dömötör tower. The construction began in 1913, it was not completed until 1930.

The <u>Serb-Orthodox Church</u> is dating from the second half of the 18th century. The baroque style with classical elements dominates its architecture.

The **New Synagogue** building (1903) was strongly influenced by Chief Rabbi





Immánuel Lőw, a scholar, who took an active part in designing the building, by supporting the work of the architect Lipót Baumhorn.

Festival

SZIN is one of the longest running multi-genre music festivals in the world, taking place in Szeged, Hungary. Started in 1968, the festival predates Woodstock by a year.

Architectural highlights of Subotica The **Synagogue from Subotica** is managed as a tourist attraction and concert venue, but it is also used by the small local Jewish community, for services and various events. There are also plans to set up a permanent Jewish exhibition.

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Subotica is an ecclesiastical territory or diocese of the **Roman Catholic Church** in Vojvodina, Serbia. It is part of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Belgrade. The Diocese is located in the city of Subotica. János Pénzes currently serves as bishop.

The Franciscan Church, **Serbian Orthodox Church** and the St Therese Cathedral. Churches also deserved special attention. They were built in the last decades of the 19th century and first decades of the 20th century. At that time, the following churches were built: the St. Rokus Church (1896), the St George Church (1897), the Synagogue (1902). The Franciscan Church was reconstructed and the second tower was added in 1908. The Serbian Orthodox Church was in full reconstructed in 1910.

The <u>Historical Theatre</u> was built in 1854 as the first monumental public building in Subotica. It was declared a historic monument under state protection in 1983, and in 1991 it was added to the National Register of Serbia as a monument of an extraordinary cultural value. Its reconstruction took place in 2007.

Visit the Vučedol culture museum

The story of Vučedol culture - European civilization. The archaeological site Vučedol is located along the bank of Dunav and it is one of the most important sites of Eneolithic period. Vučedol was first inhabited around 6000 BC, at the time of the appearance of the first European farmers. During its days of glory, the Vučedol culture stretched across a large area with a width of 700 km which included ten European states of today: the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Austria, Hungary, Romania, Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and Albania. Pottery especially stands out in the material culture and its outstanding technological quality and aesthetic values speak of a highly developed civilization. Iti is civilisation of revolutionary discoveries. They invented monoksils – big boats used for hunting fish on Danube; first Indo - European calendar; first bagpipes, dancing with music as an expression; they also made the first beer.

Tour through Ilok

Ilok – The royal city on the Danube. Here lived and died Saint Ivan Kapistran - Apostle of Europe and the first advocate of the unification of Europe. Ilok is the seat of the Croatian and Hungarian nobleman and King of Bosnia Nikola Iločki. He minted his own money showing the Croatian coat of arms (chessboard) for the first time. Ilok is a city of wine. It houses the oldest wine cellar in this part of Europe. The Ilok Traminer wine was served at the coronation of Elizabeth II, and has been drunk at the English court since the 19th century. Valuable monuments from the period of the Ottoman Empire, from the time of Suleiman the Magnificent, have been preserved in Ilok: Turbe and Hamam. A rare ginkgo biloba tree also grows here. In addition to its rich cultural heritage, Ilok can also boast of being a place where the best fish stew of the best Danube fish is prepared and eaten.

Visit Pannonhalma Archabbey (Monastery) + library & Winery

The oldest (Benedictine) abbey in Hungary with an over 1,000-year history is situated in a striking location on the Mount of St. Martin and is visible from afar. The hill is known as the Mount of Saint Martin because St. Martin of Tours, the abbey's patron saint, is said to have been born here in the early 4th century. The library and the Classicist hall are the highlight on tours of the abbey. In addition to the historic cloister, the precious library and splendid basilica, a beautiful herb garden and the superbly equipped wine cellar also welcome visitors. The courtyard in front of the church offers stunning views of the surrounding countryside. The abbey has been included on the list of UNESCO World Heritage sites since 1996.

ARBORETUM: The arboretum is free to visit on a self-auided walk.

The abbey's 22-hectare garden has been an integral part of the Benedictine monks' daily life since the monastery was founded in 996. It includes Abbey's arboretum, home to over a thousand species of plants and almost 150 species of birds. In addition to the familiar woody and herbaceous plants of our everyday life; hazel, sum, linden, stork's nose and bloody swallow-wort, there are also special species such as the silky-leaved gum tree and the ironwood, which are rare in our country.

ABBEY WINERY PANNONHALMA

The re-establishment of the abbey's viticultural and winegrowing tradition began with the vineyard planting programme following the reacquisition of part of the old abbey estates, continued with the construction of the new cellar and wine house, and since March 2004 the relaunched Pannonhalma Abbey Winery has been open to the public. The visit is guided by the Pannonhalma Abbey Winery and includes an insight into the history of Benedictine viticulture and wine culture, a tour of the new complex, a tour of the winemaking process and a tasting. Regional Museum located in a renaissance castle in the middle of the city castle park has a rich exhibition on the life of people on the Mura from the first settlement to the present. It is showcasing the interweaving of the cultural influences of the neighboring countries and the creativity that comes from ethnic, national and religious diversity. The latter is also reflected in a permanent exhibition that will take you into the poetic story of life along the Mura river, throughout the centuries, all the way to the present. The permanent exhibition has been awarded a special recognition by the European Forum.

Experiencing the challenge "Escape from Murska Sobota"

Escape town adventure will offer fun and active exploration of the city - it consists of almost detective uncovering of clues while visiting the most interesting sights of Murska Sobota. The challenge will include among others a presentation of parts of cultural-tourism product Jewish path in Murska Sobota (in Art Nouveau city centre), taste of some local culinary products in "Treasury of Prekmurje delights", self-guiding app for Jewish heritage sites (a tool developed within Transdanube Travel Stories project), VR presentation of former Murska Sobota synagogue (designed by famous architect Lipot baumhorn and demolished in 1954), VR presentation of architect's Feri Novak legacy, religious diversity with visits of The Cathedral of St Nicholas One and Evangelical church's neo-Gothic complex of buildings, story of "The Republic of Prekmurje", an unrecognized state in Prekmurje in 1919 and few other points of interest like f.i. the victory monument one of the rare remaining monuments from the post war era that was erected in honour of the victors of WWII, set in the middle of a laid-out park, made of white marble and consists of a mighty obelisk and two guns. Visit of the Mansion Rakičan and park

The fortified base in Rakičan was first mentioned in historic sources in the 15th cent. The country house as it is today was shaped during an extensive conversion in the 18th cent. It is surrounded by a well-preserved 10 hectares English landscape park, where the black walnut, tulip trees and even hares can be found. Many walking and educational paths lead through a magical forest to the chapel and vault from the year 1880. Today, the castle enables a lively environment featuring a gallery, museum collections, café and restaurant, horse-riding centre as well accommodation.

Day 6 | Lendava

Take a bus to Lendava

Departure from Bus station Murska Sobota

Cycling tour exploring the cultural heritage of Lendava:

• Synagogue Lendava and history of Jewish community in Lendava

The Synagogue is only one of preserved monuments of the former local Jewish community – the driving power of Lendava's development until World War II. This is the main Slovene Holocaust museum. The gallery offers a permanent exhibition titled 'Judaism of Prekmurje'. The ground level is adorned with 52 graphics by the Israeli artist Dan Reisinger, titled 'Ognjeni zvitki' (transl.: firescrolls), which the author had presented to the municipality of Lendava.

• The Holy Trinity Chapel and the Mummy of Mihael Hadik

Chapel of the Holy Trinity, protector of Lendava, is surrounded by the picturesque vineyards and as a proud white guard it watches over the town below. On this strategically important point for protection against intruders once stood a military post. Due to its carefully chosen position not even the Turks were able to conquer it during the attacks in the 16th and 17th centuries. In 1728, the grateful believers built the chapel on the Čonka hill, which you can visit and see the mummified body of general Mihael Hadik, one of the greatest heroes in the battles with the Turks.

• Lendava Gallery - Museum in Lendava Castle

Experience the tourism product "Casting in bronze" and various permanent exhibitions. Lendava Castle was first mentioned in documents dating back to 1192, but the structure we are familiar with today was created in the $18^{\rm th}$ century. Since 1973, the castle has been home to the Gallery-Museum of Lendava, which collects, preserves, studies and promotes the cultural heritage of the Lendava Municipality and the Hungarians from Pomurje.

The museum collection boasts a permanent archaeological, historical and ethnological exhibition, as well as a memorial room for the most famous sculptor of Lendava, György Zala.

• Vinarium Tower

The watchtower Vinarium Lendava, standing 53.3 meters tall, offers an incredible 360° view of the colorful landscape that stretches from the settlement of Lendavske gorice all the way to the river basin of Mura and encompasses a wonderful view of the plains and hills of Slovenia, Hungary, Croatia and Austria. You can reach the highest platform of the tower by a comfortable ride with the elevator or by climbing 240 steps, where you will then experience the most beautiful vantage point for many miles around.





Cuk Wine House (Hiša vina Cuk)

The house of wine Cuk sits at the highest peak of Lendavske gorice hills, offering a magnificent view of the area. Famous not only for the beautifully groomed surroundings, eye-catching straw roof and excellent wines with the »post butterfly« logo, but also their hospitality and kindness. Zipline Vinarium

Zipline Vinarium is a new feature at of the Vinarium lookout tower in Lendavske gorice and the first in the eastern part of the country and the first in Slovenia to have two parallel steel cables, so that two visitors can descend at the same time. The slightly more than 500-meter-long steel cables allow descending between 50 and 60 kilometers per hour at the fastest point).

Day 7 | Jerzualem & Departure

Guided experience "Knight Andrew of Jeruzalem"

Jeruzalem Slovenia embroidered with a golden yarn, is a treasure of our region; with its holy name, energy lines, wine road, exceptional viewpoints with a view of three countries: Austria, Hungary and Croatia, and a pilgrimage church – the town justifies the name of the heavenly place. In the 12th century the Crusaders passed through it in search for a way into today's Middle East Jerusalem. The Church of the Holy Mother of Sorrows from the 17th century like a lighthouse glows above the dark green ocean of waves of surrounding hills with thick manes of vineyards. The church used to be a Crusader's chapel, and was later gradually converted into a Baroque church. Jeruzalem was given to the Crusaders by Friderik of Ptuj, and the town has remained a place of pilgrimage. The history of Jeruzalem Slovenia which hides more than we could have ever imagined is explained by Andrew of Jerusalem the only survived Knight of the Cross coming to Jeruzalem Slovenia 800 years ago.

Presentation of myths and legends of Jeruzalem that are the basis for a new tourism product under preparation that will include also several infrastructure elements along the village.
