

Final Conference Danube PeerChains Project

18-19th October 2022 Iași, România











The final conference of the DTP DanubePeerChains was realized in collaboration with the European Clusters Alliance and the European Cluster Collaboration Platform within <u>Sustainability Forum</u> on October 18-19th, 2022, Iași, România.

<u>Sustainability Forum</u> aimed to strengthen cooperation between the countries of South-East Europe and the Danube Region for the achievement of the global objectives of sustainable development through a multidisciplinary and comprehensive approach in-line with the SEE 2030 Strategy and UN 2030 Agenda.

The main sustainable development goals that the event promoted were: Decent work and economic growth-8, Industry, innovation and infrastructure- 9 – and Partnerships to achieve the goals- 17

The forum theme encompassed several aspects ranging from the role of clusters in generating green, digital and resilient value chains, challenges faced by the labour force, bio-based business models, ecological agriculture, sustainable communities up to precision medicine.

The concept of the forum included the engagement of all categories of the quadruple-helix model: policy makers, business representatives, academia & research, and civil society, in the form of panel sessions, debates, and round-table discussions, focusing on promoting examples of good practice and identifying ways to multiply these examples.

A particular highlight was represented by the adjacent EEN brokerage event at the end of the first day.

The event was an excellent opportunity to exchange best practices and experience gathered across several European cooperation projects such as DTP DanubePeerChains, DTP GoDanuBio, Interreg Europe InnoIndustry, COSME MedicNest.
