Context of the CCR START project development



AlNova is an independent non-governmental organisation which fulfils its mission through the provision of adult learning, applied research, and consultancy.

Municipality of Svätý Jur, Western Slovakia. AlNova is located in this town already for 20 years.







Background of the CCR START project development

The project concept focuses on small and medium size municipalities in the Danube region which are facing similar challanges:

- often missing experience and capacities to tackle new challenges (brain drain, migration, participatory planing of local development, demographic change, ageing population, strengthening the employment);
- losing their previous social and economic vitality especially in their historic centers:
- and do not have appropriate skills and tools to integrate the key stakeholders into their revitalization strategies.



The project idea was developed on a basis of experience with the Central Europe project EPOurban.

Process of the CCR START project elaboration

Outline of the CCR START project elaboration:

- 3 meetings of the project team;
- search and communication with potential project partners (municipalities and experts);
- formal consultation with DTP programme manager;
- elaboration of the midterm and final report;
- and Elaboration of the application concept for the Danube Transnational Programme.





Beyond the START funding scheme

The CCR project proposal was primarily designed to contribute to the DTP:

Priority Axis 4: Well Governed Danube Region

<u>Specific Objective 4.1</u> Improve institutional capacities to tackle major societal challenges


The CCR project proposal counted also with alternative strategies for next development outside the DTP scheme. And as Priority Axis 4 of the DTP was not opened in the second programme call (spring 2017) the project proposal was adapted for alternative funding scheme (URBACT). And also other posibilities of the project funding were evaluated by the project team.

The project idea was further developed and transformed with help of key project partners. This adapted project is now under preparation for cross border INTERREG SK-AT funding scheme.
